
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

- Conducted online, January 13–20, 2023, using Ipsos KnowledgePanel
 - 1,539 adults, ± 3.5% margin of error
 - 1,050 likely voters, ± 4.2% margin of error

Jobs, economy, inflation, and homelessness named as top issues for Californians






Half or fewer Californians say the state is going in the right direction





After receding in 2021, economic pessimism has returned






Homelessness and housing affordability are seen as equally big problems

% saying big problem






Overwhelming majorities say the presence of homeless people has increased in their community






The share saying the budget situation is a big problem remains similar to recent years






Views differ on several elements of the proposed budget

Majorities have little to no confidence in President Biden




Most are pessimistic about President Biden and Congress working together
